ii. BAS-National Science Olympiad 2015 held on 05 June 2015

The BAS-National Science Olympiad 2015 was held successfully this year both at the divisional level and national level. The Science Olympiad 2015 at divisional level was held on Friday 9 January 2015 at 6 centers in the metropolitan Dhaka and at 18 centers throughout the country covering the remote areas, like Mongla Port in the southwest, Bandarban, Khagrachari in the southeast, Sylhet in the northeast and Dinajpur in the northwest region of the country.

The Science Olympiad 2015 at national level (NSO 2015) was held on Friday, 5 June 2015 at the Curzon Hall auditorium, Dhaka University. The Science Olympiad started at 9.00 am with the National Anthem and flag hoisting. Prof. Dr. Mesbahuddin Ahmad, President of the Academy hoisted the National flag and inaugurated the National Science Olympiad 2015. The Academy flag was hoisted by Prof. Dr. Mohammad Ali Asgar, Fellow, BAS and Convener, BAS-Science Olympiad 2015. The BAS National Science Olympiad 2015 was started through release of pigeons, balloons and festoons.

The test for NSO 2015 was started in the Curzon Hall Auditorium at 10.00 am and continued for one and half hour. The open question and answer session was started at 1.00 pm and continued till 2.30 pm.

The Prize Distribution Ceremony was held at 3.30 pm. Architect Yeafesh Osman, Hon'ble State Minister, Ministry of Science and Technology was the Chief Guest and Professor Dr. AAMS Arefin Siddique, Vice Chancellor, Dhaka University, Golam Sarwar, Editor, Samakal and Syed Waseque Md. Ali, Managing Director, First Security Islami Bank Ltd. were the Special Guests. The ceremony was chaired by Prof. Dr. Meshabuddin Ahmad, President of the Academy. The Chief Guest distributed stipends, medals, certificates, and books to the Olympiad winners.

i. Indian Science and Research Fellowship (ISRF) Program

As per Memorandum of Agreement signed between Bangladesh Academy of Sciences and Department of Science and Technology, Govt. of India, the Academy for the 1st time called nomination from the universities and research organizations for Indian Science and Research Fellowship (ISRF) program 2015 through BAS website and letters to the head of organizations and science related departments.

The Academy received 20 nominations from the universities and research organizations. The peer review committee constituted by the Academy examined the nominations and selected 17 nominations finally. The Academy sent 17 nominations to the Centre for International Cooperation in Sciences (CICS), Chennai, India which is the coordinating body for the program.

The Director, CICS informed the Academy of selection of 10 scientists recommended by the Academy for ISRF program. The Department of Science and Technology, Govt. of India approved the nomination of 10 scientists and informed the Academy to float the list of ISRF Fellows on BAS website.

The Academy, this year, received a grant of USD 14,500 equivalent to BDT 11,16,000 from the North American Bangladeshi Islamic Community (NABIC). iii. 11th AASSA Regional Workshop on "Gender Issues in Science Research and Education", 26-27 August 2015, Seoul, Korea

The Korean Academy of Science and Technology (KAST) hosted the 11th AASSA Regional Workshop on "Gender Issues in Science Research and Education" on 26-27 August 2015 in Seoul, Republic of Korea, in conjunction with the Gender Summit 6 Asia Pacific 2015. The workshop was jointly organized by the Association of Academies and Societies of Sciences in Asia (AASSA) and supported by the InterAcademy Partnership (IAP).

The AASSA Regional Workshop on "Women in Science and Engineering" were held for three times: the 1st was in Baku Azerbaijan in 2012; the 2nd was in New Delhi India in 2013, and the 3rd was in Izmir, Turkey in 2014. Local Academies were the host organizations.

The outcome of these workshops are: first, the establishment of the "Special Committee for Women in Science and Engineering" in AASSA, and second, the writing of a report titled "Women Scientists in Asia". The final report will be published and distributed on 26th of August, 2015. This year's workshop was the 11th international workshop by AASSA, and KAST was the host organization.

- Have demonstrated outstanding accomplishments in clinical medicine, medical education, public health or health policy;
- Show significant promise for engagement and leadership on health issues affecting the wider society.

The Academy nominated Dr. Fazle Rabbi Chowdhury, Registrar, Department of Medicine, Sylhet M.A.G.Osmani Medical College Hospital, Sylhet, to attend the 5TH IAMP Young Physician Leaders (YPL).
